

## Peter Charles believes he has discovered a future Hickstead Derby winner in Murka's Vindicat W.



The growing list of Grand Prix show jumpers to have been sold as talented young horses at the Brightwells Stars of the Future Sale since being introduced six years ago has been a massive success story.

British Nations Cup star Peter Charles believes he has found a future star in Murka's Vindicat W who, at only the age of 9 years, won the Bunn Leisure Derby Trial at Hickstead last week.

Peter Charles said "He is a very nice horse to ride. He jumped clear in a Grand Prix in France last week, and he is coming on –he has got a big future."

Vindicat W, a son of Guidam out of a Libero H mare, was sold at the Brightwells August Stars of the Future Sale in 2007 as a 5 year old to Peter Charles for £51,000. He was selected by Brightwells Belgium Agent Danny Telen and owned by his Dutch friend Herman van Triest.

Vindicat W now heads to the Falsterbo Nations Cup show in Sweden.

The selection for this year's Stars of the Future Sale, staged alongside the British Young Horse Show Jumping Championships at Addington Manor on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> – Saturday 20<sup>th</sup>, has now been completed.

Richard Botterill, Auctioneer and Organiser, said "We have viewed over 140 horses over the last two weeks throughout Europe and have selected 46 really exciting 3, 4 and 5 year olds for this year's sale. The standard of quality at the selections was very high and we look forward to selling some real stars in this year's auction".
